The Senate of the Sixty–fifth Legislature of the State of Utah met in the Senate Chamber at the State Capitol Complex and virtually in the Third Extraordinary Session at 4:30 p.m. on Wednesday, September 13, 2023.

PROCLAMATION

Cox, Governor of the State of Utah, by virtue of the authority vested in me by the Constitution and Laws of the State of Utah, do by this Proclamation call the Senate only of the 65th Legislature of the State of Utah into the Third Extraordinary Session at the Utah State Capitol in Salt Lake City, Utah, on the 13th day of September 2023, at 4:30 p.m., for the following purpose:

For the Senate to consent to appointments made by the Governor to positions within state government of the State of Utah since the close of the 2023 General Session of the Legislature of the State of Utah.
